Top 10 Tips for Great Pictures

- 1. Look your subject in the eye
- 2. Use a plain background
- 3. Use flash outdoors
- 4. Move in close
- 5. Move it from the middle
- 6. Lock the focus
- 7. Know your flash's range
- 8. Watch the light
- 9. Take some vertical pictures
- 10. Be a picture director

Photography Rules

One thing to remember about photography rules is that you don't always have to follow them; sometimes it is better to break the rule. It depends on the situation.

Rule of Thirds – The rule of thirds says that you should put the most important elements in the image a third of the way in from a side or a third of the way down from the top or up from the bottom, or where these lines intersects.

Leading Lines – Leading lines are the path your eye travels as you view an image. The lines lead you into the image or through the image. These lines can be straight, diagonal, curvy or any other type of line.

Background – The background is almost as important as the main subject. If the background is busy or the subject blends with the background then it is a distraction. When you photograph look around for a background that is plain and/or unobtrusive with the foreground subject.

Cropping – An image will often lack impact if the main subject is too small or lost in the surroundings. Crop in to show your viewer just what it was that held your interest enough for you to make the photograph.

Finally, not a rule, but a piece of advice. The way to get outstanding images is to shoot and shoot and shoot. Work a subject, try using the rules then try breaking the rules. Shoot it horizontally and shoot it vertically. Digital is different from film. We no longer have to worry about the cost of each exposure, just the time and storage it takes to go through and keep all of those images.
