8 SECRETS FOR SHARPER WILDLIFE PHOTOS

Everyone wants sharper wildlife photos but not everyone knows the basics of how to capture them. In the below video tutorial, pro photographer Steve Perry shares his "eight secrets" to help you shoot sharp photos of birds and other animals every time.

#1 Shutter Speed

Shutter speed is one of the most critical settings to master when it comes to shooting sharp images. "The problem is there's a prevailing assumption out there that shutter speeds like 1/250th of a second are fast enough for most subjects and something like 1/1000th of a second should be enough to stop any kind of action. So, it's often difficult to convince people to crank their shutter speeds up to more like 1/1250th, 1/2000th or even 1/4000th of a second for faster action."

Here's a handy guide of typical shutter speed settings for various birds:

- Large birds like owls, eagles, and geese: around 1/1000-1/1250.
- Medium-sized birds like songbirds and ducks: around 1/2000-1/2500.
- Fast or small birds like puffins: around 1/3200.
- Tiny birds like hummingbirds: around 1/4000-1/5000.

#2 Shoot from Good Support

if I'm shooting a long lens and I'm under 1/800th of second or so, I grab a monopod, or a tripod and my shots are consistently sharper than when I don't.

Smart stabilization tips include:

- Push an eyebrow in the eye cup and apply pressure when you're shooting.
- Don't "stab" the shutter button. Instead, place, touch, or roll your finger very lightly onto it.
- Tuck your elbows into your waist and move your entire body when panning.
- Focus on the part of the bird that's moving the least to reduce internal mirror shake for DSLR cameras.
- Take lots of photos to improve your odds of capturing a sharp one. You can use burst mode continuously or sporadically.
- Stabilize your lens and camera using a tripod, monopod, or the natural terrain nearby.

#3 Use the Best Autofocus (AF) Area

"Most DSLRs and mirrorless cameras feature a wide array of choices for AF areas and choosing the correct one is often the difference between capturing the photo you want and one that's sharp in all the wrong places. The trick is to use the smallest AF area you can reliably keep on your subject."
