

May Competition Night: Judge Dr. Lloyd Beaver

Co-President Gary Powell welcomed Dr. Beaver and his wife Margaret to the competition night. Dr. Beaver is from the Merced Camera Club. His photo interests include, photographing birds, nature, and pictorial prints.

Some of Lloyd's comments about the images he saw were; Prints- Watch the back ground – Don't pace the subject "dead center" in the print – Watch the coloring- pay attention to the edge of the photograph. Watch white objects in the background and depth of field.. Correct perspective if you can. Images with black background need to be grounded. Watch mergers in the image. Some photos can be cropped into more than one image. Sometimes the exposure should be increased/decreased. Digital images: Don't cut heads off of your subjects. Use three quarter profile. Use 'fill' lighting when you can. Make certain your subject is in sharp focus. Challenges: (faces) Watch color lighting and the edges of your photo. Use a darker shirt or clothing if you can. Watch softness of photos. Pictorial: pay attention to the foreground on your images. Watch elements in the photo that will draw your eye away from the focus of image. Watch background and exposure. Try not to cut off items in photo. Nature: image needs to be sharp and tell a story. Watch exposure.

April Program Night

Renis and Rebecca Harvey gave us an over view of studio lighting. Rebecca had two studio scenarios set up. The backdrops were black and white with two models. All of our guests and members had an opportunity to use their cameras to practice using a model.

Rebecca was there to help with any questions and/or problems we might have had with our cameras. Not only did we learn about studio lighting, we learned how to use light in any situation. Watch the direction of the light. Use a fill light or reflector to bring in more light. (Or to take light away)

Thank you Rebecca and Renis for fun and interesting evening.
