
Image Resizing for Modesto Camera Club Competitions

The following steps will explain the process for resizing your images to send in for Modesto Camera Club Competitions. The process is simple but it can be intimidating the first few times. The thing to remember first is to **save your original image** in case you do make a mistake.

This information is for PC users. I am sure Mac users will find some of the information useful. The images you see were taken off of my lap top computer as I went through the steps. I am using Photoshop Elements 9 to show the steps. Anyone using a Photoshop program should be able to follow the steps easily.

This first image shows original size of the image. It is a very large JPEG file. All images should be in the JPEG format.

This image has been copped to 8 X 10 inches. To resize this image click on "image".



A window will appear. Move the cursor to **resize** and then to **image size**. Click.

The next window will say "Image Size". We are using Pixels to resize not inches. *This is where we all start to go wrong.* The **maximum** *width* we use is **1024** pixels. The **maximum** *height* for an image is **768** pixels.

Hint: By resizing your longest or tallest side first you should be okay. If that does not make the image small enough adjust the pixels that are <u>over</u> the maximum allowed. By adjusting *either* the height or width to the maximum your image will not be cut off or too small for competition.



When you click OK your image will become smaller. You have resized your image.

Select Filter

Alt+Ctrl+R

Image Size... Alt+Ctrl+I
Canvas Size... Alt+Ctrl+C

Enhance Layer

Magic Extractor... Alt+Shift+Ctrl+V

Crop



Now you need to **save** your resized image. If you have completed all of the basic steps. Your image should be sized correctly for the competitions.

Go to "file" and then to "Save As". When you click on the "Save As" a window will open.



It will ask for a file name. I usually keep the original file name to rename for competitions. For all of my resized camera club images I use a capital **RS.** I move them to a separate file so I can find them later.



The last image shows the new size of the photo. Click OK and you should have your image resized properly.





For our new members and those of us who keep forgetting, Sam Shaw has sent in the rules for competition in NATURE, TRAVEL, and PHOTOJOURNALISM. He has also given me the Photo essay rules. If any member needs a copy I will have some at the next meeting.

For projected digital images, the image needs to be resized to the following dimensions: It must be a JPG image with a maximum <u>horizontal</u> dimension of 1024 pixels and a maximum <u>vertical</u> dimension of 768 pixels.

Nature

Nature photography is restricted to the use of the photographic process to depict observations from all branches of natural history, except anthropology and archeology, in such a fashion that a well informed person will be able to identify the subject material and to certify as to its honest presentation. The **story telling value** of a photograph **must** be weighed more than the pictorial quality while maintaining high technical quality. Human elements shall not be present, except where those human elements enhance the nature story. The presence of scientific bands, scientific tags or radio collars on wild animals is permissible. Photographs of artificially produced hybrid plants or animals, mounted specimens, or obviously set arrangements, are ineligible, as is any form of manipulation that alters the truth of the photographic statement. **No techniques that add to, relocate, replace, or remove pictorial elements except by cropping are permitted. Techniques that enhance the presentation of the photograph without changing the nature story or the pictorial content are permitted. All adjustments must appear natural. The removal, or manipulation, of colors contained within the original image to enable the production of monochrome images is permitted.**

Travel

A Photo Travel image must express the feeling of a time and place, and portray a land, its people, or a culture in its natural state. Photo Travel images have no geographical limitations. Ultra close-ups, which lose their identity and studio-type model shoots, are unacceptable. Techniques that add to, relocate, replace or remove any element of the original image, except by cropping, are not permitted. Techniques that enhance the presentation of the image, without changing the photo travel content, are permitted. All adjustments must appear natural. The removal, or manipulation, of colors contained within the original image to enable the production of monochrome images is permitted.

Photojournalism

Photojournalism images shall consist of pictures or sequences with **informative content** and **emotional impact**, including human interest, documentary and spot news. The journalistic value of the photograph shall be considered over pictorial quality. In the interest of credibility, photographs which misrepresent the truth, such as manipulation to alter the subject matter, or situations which are set up for the purpose of photography, are unacceptable in Photojournalism.
