*In June* our judge was **Byron Hindman**. Bryon judged our images in November of 2011 and he agreed to help us out again. He was accompanied by his wife Marilyn. He is a member of the Cordova Club and a longtime member of the Photo Society of America. His interests include photographing "table top" still-life's and landscapes. He enjoys teaching photography skills. He gave us a short lecture on what he looks for and how we may improve our images. Here are some of the things he commented on.











The first thing he mentioned was that there is difference between competition, commercial, and family photography. His main focus was on the competition quality of images and what we should be watching for.

When your image is in a competition most times the judges only have about four seconds to evaluate your image. Keep your image simple. Start away from the subject if you can and then move in closer and closer as many as six times to get different image results. Placement is important. You should keep the main subject in a good spot in the frame. "Do Border Patrol." You should keep white or light areas away from the border of your images as they will take the viewer eyes away from the main subject. Do not allow leading lines to move out of the image. Contrast of color is important and contrast of design makes a subject stand out.

During his competition comments he mentioned that he likes vertical verses horizontal images. But, he did make nice comments about the horizontal images also. He likes the look of older subjects in photographs.

Byron and his wife drove a long way to judge our images. The Modesto Camera Club thanks you Byron for your judging expertise and the short lesson.

Modesto Camera Club brochure is finished. There will be copies for anyone who would like to have one. Camera Club guests will be given a copy of the brochure when they arrive. 
<u>PHOTOCLAVE:</u> Photoclave is being held in Modesto, November 2, 3, 4, 2012. Modesto Camera Club belongs to the San Joaquin Camera Club Council. Each council can enter 20 images in color print, creative, color image, and nature. The MCC images compete with other camera club images in an intraclub competition. The best judged images will go to Photoclave to compete with other councils.

The print images need to be to Sam Shaw prior to September  $9^{th}$ . If you have other questions you may contact Sam Shaw. Maximum print is 16 X 20 inches. The minimum size is 5 X 7 inches. Digital image sizes are the same as for our competition.

For our new members and those of us who keep forgetting, Sam Shaw has sent in the rules for competition in NATURE, TRAVEL, and PHOTOJOURNALISM. He has also given me the Photo essay rules. If any member needs a copy I will have some at the next meeting.

For projected digital images, the image needs to be resized to the following dimensions: It must be a JPG image with a maximum <u>horizontal</u> dimension of 1024 pixels and a maximum <u>vertical</u> dimension of 768 pixels.

#### **Nature**

Nature photography is restricted to the use of the photographic process to depict observations from all branches of natural history, except anthropology and archeology, in such a fashion that a well informed person will be able to identify the subject material and to certify as to its honest presentation. The **story telling value** of a photograph **must** be weighed more than the pictorial quality while maintaining high technical quality. Human elements shall not be present, except where those human elements enhance the nature story. The presence of scientific bands, scientific tags or radio collars on wild animals is permissible. Photographs of artificially produced hybrid plants or animals, mounted specimens, or obviously set arrangements, are ineligible, as is any form of manipulation that alters the truth of the photographic statement. **No techniques that add to, relocate, replace, or remove pictorial elements except by cropping are permitted. Techniques that enhance the presentation of the photograph without changing the nature story or the pictorial content are permitted. All adjustments must appear natural. The removal, or manipulation, of colors contained within the original image to enable the production of monochrome images is permitted.** 

### **Travel**

A Photo Travel image must express the feeling of a time and place, and portray a land, its people, or a culture in its natural state. Photo Travel images have no geographical limitations. Ultra close-ups, which lose their identity and studio-type model shoots, are unacceptable. Techniques that add to, relocate, replace or remove any element of the original image, except by cropping, are not permitted. Techniques that enhance the presentation of the image, without changing the photo travel content, are permitted. All adjustments must appear natural. The removal, or manipulation, of colors contained within the original image to enable the production of monochrome images is permitted.

### **Photojournalism**

**Photojournalism** images shall consist of pictures or sequences with **informative content** and **emotional impact**, including human interest, documentary and spot news. The journalistic value of the photograph shall be considered over pictorial quality. In the interest of credibility, photographs which misrepresent the truth, such as manipulation to alter the subject matter, or situations which are set up for the purpose of photography, are unacceptable in Photojournalism.
