If you are having a problem with shooting a certain type of image and would like to seek advice from other members...this is a great time to ask for advice. You might like to have suggestions on cropping, processing or other suggestions on improving your images.

Bring your great or unusual images to share too. Do you travel to unusual places or places you would like to share with other members? Bring ten images on a disk or zip drive to the meeting to share.

This would be a good night to bring a friend or family member so they can see all of the different types of images our members are capturing in their photo travel.

In May our judge was Shirley Ward. She is very involved with the Madera Camera Club and has judged our images in the past. She has judged international shows and always gives very good advice for improving our images.

Shirley's comments about our print images included suggestions that we should not crop the image to close to the main subject. Several of our members were cropping so close that the main part of the image was merging to the edges of the print. On several of the prints there white areas around the edge of the image that would be distracting. We need to watch our focus and details in the image.

We had a lot of images for her to judge and she took the time to make constructive comments for everyone. Thank you Shirley for taking your time to judge our images again this year.

For our new members and those of us who keep forgetting, Sam Shaw has sent in the rules for competition in NATURE, TRAVEL, and PHOTOJOURNALISM. He has also given me the Photo essay rules. If any member needs a copy I will have some at the next meeting.

For projected digital images, the image needs to be resized to the following dimensions: It must be a JPG image with a maximum <u>horizontal</u> dimension of 1024 pixels and a maximum <u>vertical</u> dimension of 768 pixels.

Nature

Nature photography is restricted to the use of the photographic process to depict observations from all branches of natural history, except anthropology and archeology, in such a fashion that a well informed person will be able to identify the subject material and to certify as to its honest presentation. The **story telling value** of a photograph **must** be weighed more than the pictorial quality while maintaining high technical quality. Human elements shall not be present, except where those human elements enhance the nature story. The presence of scientific bands, scientific tags or radio collars on wild animals is permissible. Photographs of artificially produced hybrid plants or animals, mounted specimens, or obviously set arrangements, are ineligible, as is any form of manipulation that alters the truth of the photographic statement. **No techniques that add to**, relocate, replace, or remove pictorial elements except by cropping are permitted. Techniques that enhance the presentation of the photograph without changing the nature story or the pictorial content are permitted. All adjustments must appear natural. The removal, or manipulation, of colors contained within the original image to enable the production of monochrome images is permitted.

Travel

A Photo Travel image must express the feeling of a time and place, and portray a land, its people, or a culture in its natural state. Photo Travel images have no geographical limitations. Ultra close-ups, which lose their identity and studio-type model shoots, are unacceptable. Techniques that add to, relocate, replace or remove any element of the original image, except by cropping, are not permitted. Techniques that enhance the presentation of the image, without changing the photo travel content, are permitted. All adjustments must appear natural. The removal, or manipulation, of colors contained within the original image to enable the production of monochrome images is permitted.

Photojournalism

Photojournalism images shall consist of pictures or sequences with **informative content** and **emotional impact**, including human interest, documentary and spot news. The journalistic value of the photograph shall be considered over pictorial quality. In the interest of credibility, photographs which misrepresent the truth, such as manipulation to alter the subject matter, or situations which are set up for the purpose of photography, are unacceptable in Photojournalism.
